



- A review of 11 completed healthy home assessments revealed inadequate standards of habitability, potential health and safety hazards for residents, and energy-inefficient housing conditions.
- All participating homes had evidence of water damage, which can exacerbate and even trigger respiratory illness in both children and adults.







• 100% of assessed homes had water damage.



- Gaps, holes, and penetrations in the building envelope.
- Excessive dust.
 Suspected microbial growth.
- Pests.



- Gaps and inadequate weatherstripping in windows and entryways.
- Central HVAC system air filter in poor condition.



- Air filter missing from the central HVAC system.
- Reported that a child in the home suffered from respiratory issues.

Key Takeaways

University Of Tennessee Baker School, TVA Release Landmark Clean Energy Study

Wednesday, February 14, 2024

The University of Tennessee, Knoxville, Baker School of Public Policy and Public Affairs presented the results of a landmark Valley Pathways Study on Wednesday at the quarterly meeting of the Board of Directors for the Tennessee Valley Authority. The study is the first of its kind for the region - which includes parts of seven Southeast states. This study quantifies carbon emission sources by economic sectors and evaluates actionable strategies for the region to achieve net - zero carbon emissions by 2050. The Baker School will provide future updates as data is available.






